A retired former TOPGUN instructor and U.S. Naval Officer, Captain Ginader has served in three operational flying tours in the F-14 TOMCAT, including Commanding Officer of Fighter Squadron 21. He completed ten overseas deployments on five different aircraft carriers, accumulating over 3500 flight hours and 900 arrested landings. Having flown against MiG aircraft and going by the call sign “Wahoo,” what better person to speak with after a screening of TOP GUN 3D!
